

Dr. David Garabrant

Dr. Garabrant graduated from the Tufts University School of Medicine in Boston and completed residency training in internal medicine at Georgetown University Hospital in Washington, DC, and Boston University Medical Center in Boston. He trained in occupational medicine at the Harvard School of Public Health. He was a member of the faculty of the University of Southern California School Of Medicine 1981-88 and the faculty of the University Of Michigan School Of Public Health in 1988-2007. He became Emeritus Professor of Occupational Medicine and Epidemiology at the University of Michigan in 2007. He is board certified in both Internal Medicine and Preventive/Occupational Medicine. His professional activities include teaching, research, and the practice of clinical occupational medicine. Research interests include long-term effects of occupational and environmental chemical exposures (such as dioxins in the environment) and occupational cancer epidemiology (including studies of respiratory effects of metal removal fluids). He is also the Founding Director of the Risk Science Center at the University of Michigan School of Public Health.
