Ted Haines collaborates widely, as a clinician researcher and epidemiologist, with a focus in occupational health. He is involved in a variety of occupational epidemiological studies, including on respiratory risks of metalworking fluid exposure, manual work risk factors for Dupuytren's contracture and stress in the postal sector. He has also been collaborating in the research of Dr Bernadette Stringer, in the area of occupational health and patient safety in the surgical setting, in the development of a questionnaire, in English and French, to measure nurse-physician collaboration on acute surgical and medical wards, and in an intervention study to address work-related mental health problems. He is a systematic reviewer of the randomized controlled trial literature on conservative interventions for neck pain and surgery for carpal tunnel syndrome.
